ABOUT THE KIT

Use this kit in an early childhood or elementary classroom, library, or bookstore or at a child's party or play date.

This story hour kit is designed to complement a reading of the picture book, Happy Mamas.

Most of the activities are suitable for children aged 4-6, but could also be adapted for younger and older age groups too. It contains:

Pre-reading finger puppet activity
Smiley face Happy Me activity
Memory game
Color and cut finger puppets
Coloring pages
Take home bookmark
Variation of song "If You're Happy and You Know it"
which can also be used for Mother's Day celebrations




PRE-READING CRAFT ACTIVITY

What you need:

_	_A copy of Happy Mamas
	If you wish to promote your event within your
	community, print out the story hour poster and fill
	in the time and date of your event.
	Cardstock to print on
1	Crayons
<u> </u>	_Tape
	Print out multiples of the finger puppet shapes. If possible
	print onto card stock. Print enough of so each child can collect one or more animal from the book
	_Scissors for cutting out the animal shapes (or depending
	on age of children, cut them out in advance and omit this part)

- 1 As children are filing in for story-time, invite them to come over to the craft table.
- 2 Tell them they are going to be reading a book about lots of different mama animals and their babies.
- 3 Help children cut out and color the animal finger puppets.
- 4 Let children talk about their animal and share what they know about it where it lives, its name, what food it eats, and why they like this animal.
- (5) Then LEAVE their animals on the craft table and gather for story-time. Make sure each child knows to come back to that same space to collect her animal later you may want to have them print their name on the back.



STORY HOUR

Show the children the cover of the book Happy Mamas and invite them to share what they think it is about.

Read the book. You might want to discuss -

What was your favorite part?

What was your favorite picture?

Did you see your animal that you colored in?

What made your animal Mama happy?

What sort of things makes your own Mama happy?

What makes you happy?



Interactive Reading

Have children collect their animal finger puppets and divide them into their animal groups.

Pandas Seals

Kangaroos Elephants
Penguins Eagles
Ducks Wolves
Owls Monkeys

1 Explain to the children that you are going to read the book again, and this time, they should hold up their animal finger puppets as soon as they see a picture of their animal in the book.

2 Finish story hour with some happy music in the background as children choose a coloring sheet to complete, or they can take home along with their own bookmark.

MEMORY GAME

What you will need:

__Copy of Happy Mamas

__ Collection of beanie baby animals or stuffed toys/finger puppets

of animals in the book:

Pandas Seals
Kangaroos Elephants
Penguins Eagles
Ducks Wolves
Owls Monkeys

Or just use the 'Finger Puppets' pictures from this activity guide.

Some dolls (to represent the human Mamas)

__Box or a bag

Version 1

- ① After reading Happy Mamas to the children, invite them to come up one by one and pick a beanie from bag (do not let them see what they are picking, they can only feel).
- 2 After all the children have an animal, tell them that you are going to read the story again and you want them to listen very carefully to what made "their beanie animal mama happy" but, "shhh!", they must keep it quiet and not tell anyone else, as that will spoil the memory game they are going to play later.
- 3 After a second reading of Happy Mamas, pick random children to stand up and show their beanie animal. Now see if they can remember what made that animal happy? If they have difficulty show them the picture from the book to help them.

Version 2

Print memory game animals sheet on card stock. Cut out each card. Lay them out face down. Then kids turn one over at a time in turn, trying to match babies.



HAPPY ME ACTIVITY

Use this instead of some of the other activities or in addition to them, depending on the age of your audience and time available.

What you need:

- ___Copy of Happy Mamas
- ___Smiley Face printed out and cut out (or let children cut out themselves)
- __Crayons or markers
- ① After reading Happy Mamas, invite children to share with each other what sort of activities and people and places make them happy.
- 2 Invite children to take a smiley face cut out and fill it in with all the things that makes them happy they can use words or they can draw pictures depending on their age and ability.



SONG - Variation of "If You're Happy and You Know it"

Can be used for a Mother's Day Celebration

What	vou	will	need

CD or recording of 'If You're Happy and You Know it'
(or your own accompaniment)
Copy of Happy Mamas
Animal shapes printed out on card and glued to popsicle. Or you can use
animal beanie baby figures or finger puppets of all the animals from the book.

- 1 After children are familiar with the book, Happy Mamas (have heard it more than a couple of times), invite them to come and pick an animal picture or beanie baby from the table/box.
- 2 Tell them they are going to sing a happy song and they might already know the song, but today they are going to use different words.
- 3 Group children according to which animal/bird they have picked. Discuss with each group what sound/motion their animal made in the book and tell them that they are going to use those words in this version of the song practice with them first and encourage them to mime the actions too.

If you're happy and you know it -

Pandas – munch and crunch (let children pretend to munch food)

Seals – flip flap flop (have them flap their hands like fins)

Kangaroos – hop and leap (children bounce along)

Elephants – trumpet loud (use arm like a trunk to wave side to side)

Monkeys – swing and swoosh (use arms to show swinging)

Monkeys (can have other groups too - loop the loop, dip and dangle, tag the tail)

Penguins Slide-n-slither (children pretend to slide)

Penguins (can have other groups who wibble wobble, teeter totter or skate'n skid)

Eagles – soar up high (flap arms like wings)

Ducks - Quack Quack! (use hands to make beak motion)

Wolves -howl arooooooo! (open mouths wide)

Owls - Twit Twoooo (flap wings)


- End with If you're happy and you know it shout Hurrah!


**OR – <u>for Mother's day</u> – children could perform this song for their mothers (don't tell mothers how it ends, just invite each mother to stand beside her child as they perform) and at the end.

Children all sing:

If you're happy and you know it
HUG YOUR MAMA! (each child turns to hug Mama)
And all shout in unison "Happy Mother's Day!"













FINGER PUPPETS


